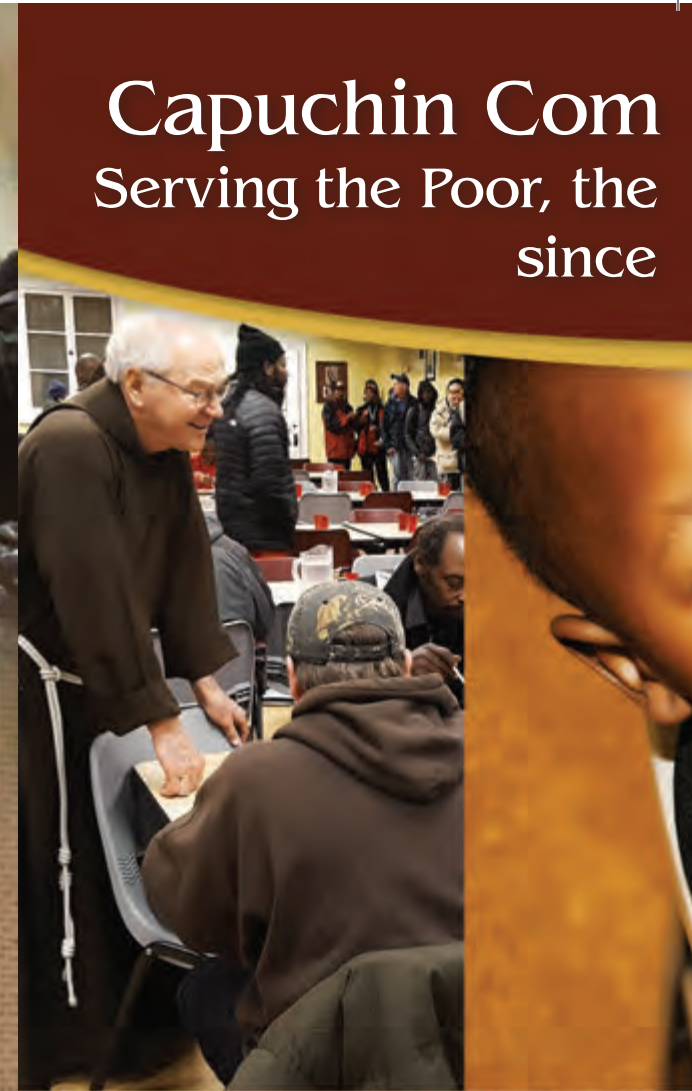

No One Should Be Hungry

At our St. Ben's Community Meal site, we serve hot, home-made dinners six nights a week in a warm, safe environment. The House of Peace site provides an emergency food pantry. No one is turned away who seeks emergency aid for food.



Every One Should Be Adequately Dressed

Through our Capuchin Clothes Closet, children can go to school with proper clothing. People can proudly go to job interviews. All who need it have warm weather gear. Through the generosity of others, we are able to distribute new and gently used clothing to be sorted and redistributed to those in need. Guests select free clothing in a respectful, store-like environment.



Health Care & Legal Aid Should Be Available to All

Columbia-St. Mary's St. Ben's Clinic and UWM Nursing Clinic, located at the House of Peace site, provide health care to the homeless, health screenings & education, direct nursing care and more. The Marquette University Legal Clinic provides legal information and referrals.

It's Difficult to Be Poor & Locate Services

The needs of many of our ministry guests are complicated by drug or alcohol dependencies, domestic violence, lack of employment, a shattered family structure, chronic mental illness, and low educational levels. Social workers are available at both ministry sites to help guests find services. We also provide assistance with bus tickets, co-pays for necessary prescriptions, hair-cuts, a shower program, eye glasses, birth certificates, IDs, GED tuition assistance plus rental and relocation issues.



Everyone Needs God

At each site, we offer our guests, staff, and volunteers the opportunity for prayer and reflection, but never require anyone to participate. Based on Gospel values, our Capuchin ministry sites serve the community by assisting families and individuals in meeting their spiritual, material, and emotional needs.
